PENIS AND PROSTATE

The incidence rate of cancer of penis is 1.5 per 100 000 population in Thailand. It varies from 0.8 in Bangkok to 2.5 in Chiang Mai (Figure 2.14.1). Starting at age 25, the age-specific incidence rate is not much changed with age. The trend does not change during the past 10 years.

The estimate incidence rate of prostate cancer in Thailand is 4.9 per 100 000 persons. It varies from 6.9 in Bangkok to 2.1 in Khon Kaen (Figure 2.14.4). The age-specific incidence rate of this cancer rapidly rises with age (Figure 2.14.5). The trend is gradually increasing during the past decade (Figure 2.14.6).

Figure 2.14.1 Penis cancer in different regions, 1995-1997

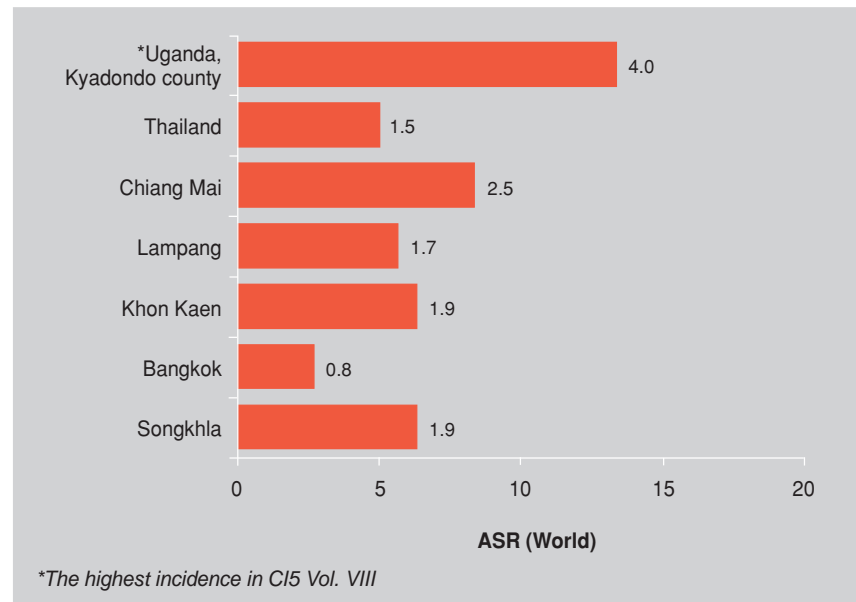


Figure 2.14.2 Age-specific incidence rates of penis cancer, 1995-1997

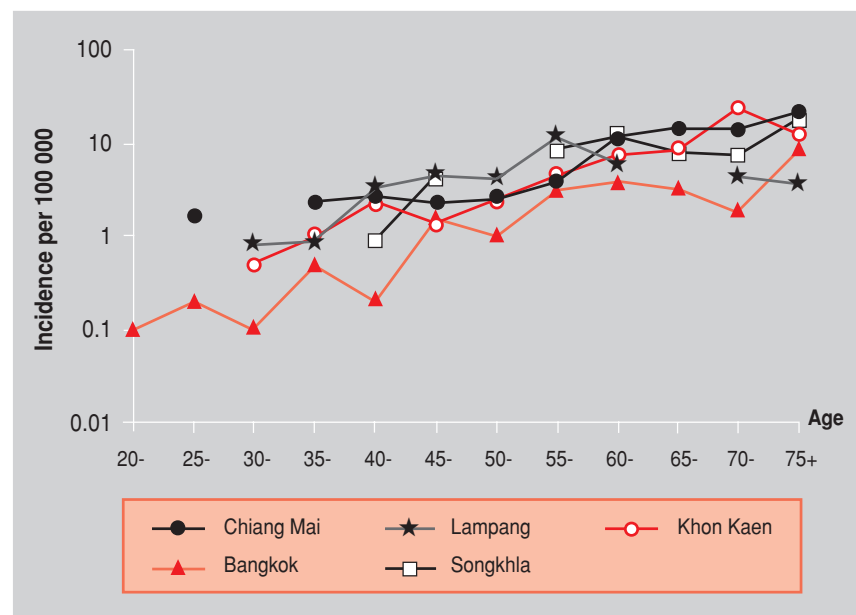


Figure 2.14.3 Trend in incidence of penis cancer

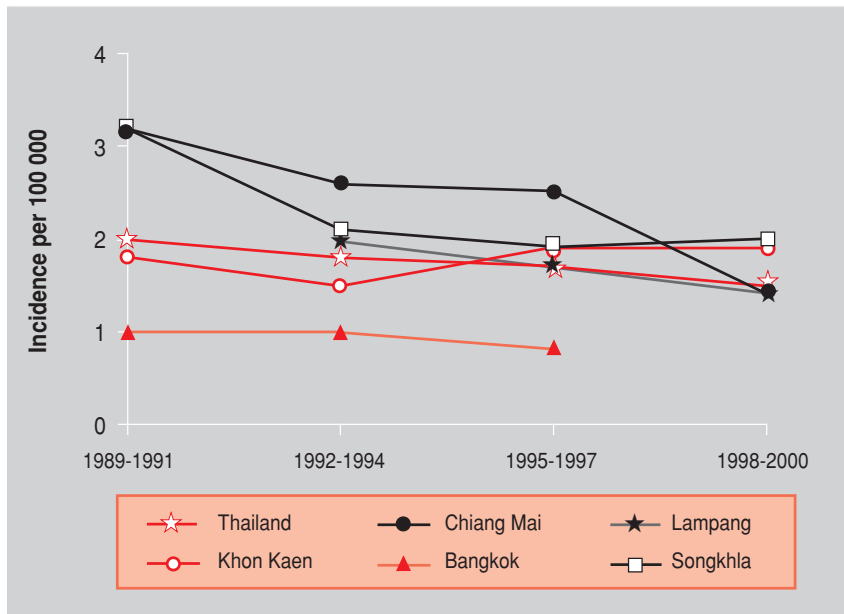


Figure 2.14.4 Prostate cancer in different regions, 1995-1997

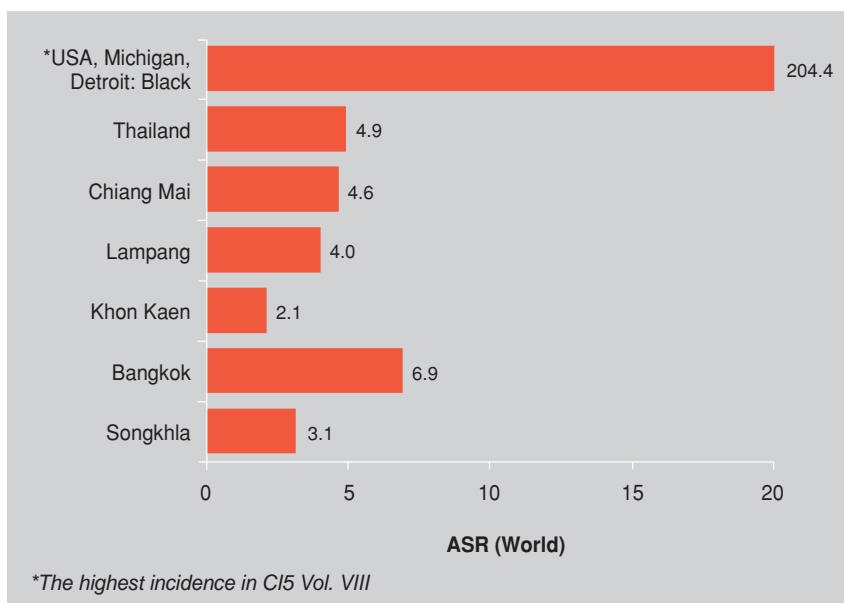


Figure 2.14.4 Age-specific incidence rates of prostate cancer, 1995-1997

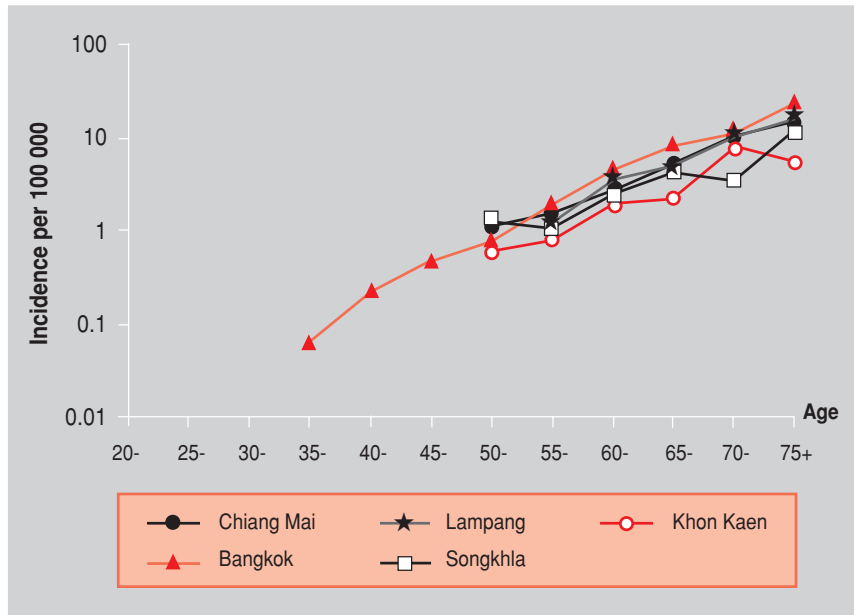


Figure 2.14.5 Trend in incidence of prostate cancer
